**Having a Bad Air Day?**

**T**he main sources of air pollution in Washington are, respectively, motor vehicles, industry, wood stoves/fireplaces and outdoor burning.

Although these sources have remained largely the same over the years, the amount of air pollution they contribute has shifted. For example, 10 years ago, motor vehicles caused 43% of Washington's air pollution and now it causes 53%. The population has grown and more people are driving.

How do we know how clean the air is? Looks can be deceiving. Sometimes, you can tell the air is dirty by the haze you see, or just by your inability to see familiar landmarks. Air pollution cannot be accurately measured that way. Even when the air looks relatively clean, air pollution can be present. Ecology and local air quality agencies monitor around the state for six air pollutants: particulate matter, carbon monoxide, ozone, nitrogen dioxide, sulfur dioxide and lead.

If levels of an air pollutant violate an air quality standard somewhere in the state, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) designates the area as "nonattainment" for that specific standard. The state must then develop and implement a plan to bring air pollution back to healthier levels.

You can find out real-time information on air pollutant concentrations in your neighborhood on the web at <http://airr.ecy.wa.gov/Public/aqn.html>. This site shows pollutant levels at monitored sites over the most recent 72 hours. Data is updated every hour. If you visit the web site, be aware that the data shown is intended only as an indicator of current air quality, and is not yet "official." To be considered official, the data received from air monitors must go through a quality assurance process. ♦

## ◆ I-405 and SE 8th St. Interchange - Bellevue

"Access Downtown" will add a new interchange on I-405 at NE 6th St. for buses and carpools, giving buses direct access to an expanded Bellevue Transit Center. It will improve freeway interchanges at NE 4th, NE 8th and SE 8th Streets. Completion - 2005.

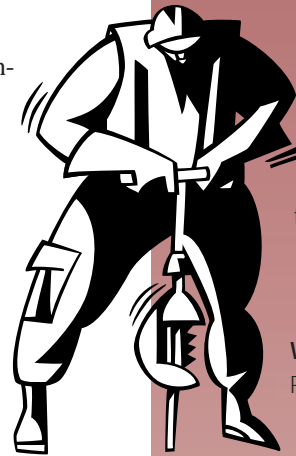
## ◆ SR 520: Bellevue to Redmond Bike Path

Construction is continuing on a new bicycle pathway between Bellevue and Redmond. Crews are clearing and grading the area, then installing concrete barrier and paving the

pathway. Work includes erosion control and marking the pavement. Expected completion — fall 2002.

## ◆ I-90: Sunset Interchange

Crews are building a full interchange at Sunset Way and I-90 just east of Issaquah. An auxiliary lane has been built on westbound I-90 joining the Sunset Way and Front St. interchanges. The existing westbound exit to Front St. is being modified. Four new bridges will be built and a fifth modified. Expected completion - summer 2003. ◆



# Redmond Construction Update

## Overlake

The intersection of NE 40th St. and 148th Ave. NE will be reconstructed to improve turning movements. Construction will begin Summer 2002.

## Willows Corridor

Preliminary engineering continues on the proposed widening of Willows Road between NE 116th and NE 124th St.

King County is planning on completing the widening of NE 124th between Willows Rd. and Redmond-Woodinville Rd. It is anticipated that construction will begin Summer 2002.

## East Redmond

Roadway work continues along East Lake Sammamish Parkway, south of NE 65th St., as a requirement of the Jefferson at Marymoor Park development. Work to continue through Summer 2002.

Design work continues on the widening of Union Hill Road between 178th Pl. and 188th Ave. NE. As part of the City's pavement management program, resurfacing work will occur at locations near 178th Pl. and 192nd Ave.

## Miscellaneous Construction

Construction of new storm drainage pipe to divert flow from Idylwood Creek will affect traffic along 172nd Ave. NE from NE 30th to NE 36th St. and continuing on NE 36th to West Lake Sammamish Parkway. Work will be ongoing June through December 2002.

The existing right-turn lane from westbound Redmond Way to 132nd Ave. NE is scheduled to be reconstructed and lengthened in Summer 2002. Expect traffic delays during this work. ◆

## Get Ready to Vote

The 57th State Legislature concluded its business in Olympia on March 14. According to Representative Laura Ruderman (D-45th), the Democrats accomplished their three major goals: pass transportation, balance the budget and adjourn on time.

In November, Washington taxpayers are going to vote on taxes for transportation capital improvements to roads, rail, public transit and ferries. The ballot is likely to include:

- 9 cent per gallon gas tax increase (would cost an average driver \$68 more per year)
- 30% increase in truck weight fees (applies only to large trucks and large RV's, no pick-ups or SUVs)
- 1% tax on sale of new/used cars (would cost average driver \$48 more per year)

This statewide funding proposal will raise \$7.8 billion over 10 years. The next step will be passage of a Regional Plan allowing King, Pierce and Snohomish county councils to place a proposal before the voters to raise funds for projects that will ease congestion on highways of statewide significance. For Redmond this means SR-520 and I-405.

The Greater Redmond Chamber of Commerce is working closely with GRTMA and other King County chambers to support the passage of these ballot measures to improve freight mobility and the competitiveness of area businesses.

## Did You Know?

Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) prevented 5,130 tons of air pollution in 2001 and reduced petroleum consumption by 6.4 million gallons, saving Washington citizens \$10 million in fuel costs.

On an average workday morning, CTR removes 19,950 vehicles from the state's roadways, a 12 percent increase in trip reduction over 1999.

CTR removes 15,900 vehicles from Puget Sound roadways each workday morning. If those vehicles added back onto the region's roadways, the equivalent of 16 additional lane miles would be needed to accommodate the demand. The cost to the state, just to construct these roadways, could approach \$92 million.
